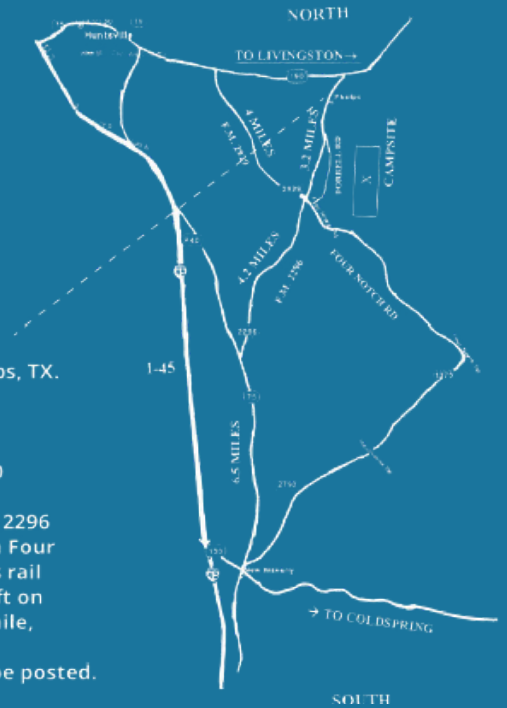

## Scholarship Trail Ride Rules

All riders are subject to TAHC rules regarding a current NEGATIVE COGGINS test.

Under no circumstances will stud horses be allowed at the campsite or on the ride itself. This rule will be enforced – **NO EXCEPTIONS!**

No uncontrollable horses/mules allowed.

All dogs must be on a leash at all times.

No glass receptacles allowed on ride.

Trail Ride buttons will be worn on outside of coats – visible at all times.

No double riding allowed.

No firearms or illegal drugs will be allowed.

No unauthorized vehicles will be allowed to follow the ride.

Each person is responsible for cleaning their campsite.

**Please make sure your horse is shod properly due to rocky terrain.**

Minors must be accompanied by a guardian or responsible adult at all times.

No vulgar language will be tolerated either in person or coming from music selected by individual's while on the ride or in camp. This is a family ride.

Under no circumstances are riders/wagons permitted to sell food or drinks on the ride or at camp unless designated by the MCFA.
